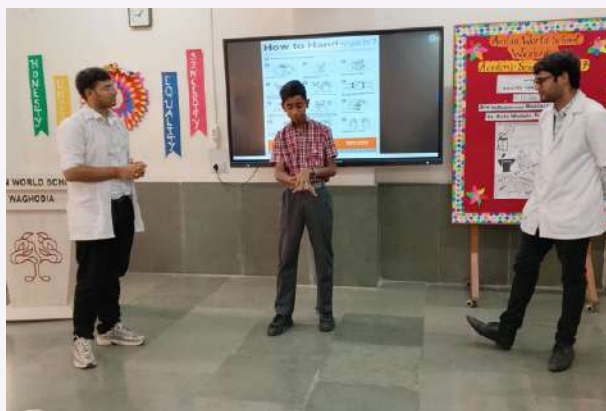
# Awareness Session

10 July 2026

An informative and engaging awareness session on Soil-Transmitted Helminthiasis (STH) was conducted for Grade VIII students by four enthusiastic third-year MBBS students of Sumandeep Vidhyapeeth. The session aimed to educate students about the causes, modes of transmission, symptoms, prevention and treatment of soil-transmitted worm infections.

Through interactive discussions and easy-to-understand explanations, the presenters highlighted the importance of maintaining good personal hygiene, washing hands with soap, wearing footwear outdoors, consuming clean food and safe drinking water and participating in regular deworming programs. The students actively participated by asking questions and sharing their thoughts, making the session both engaging and impactful.

The awareness program successfully enhanced students' understanding of preventive healthcare and reinforced the importance of healthy habits in protecting themselves and their communities from soil-transmitted infections.

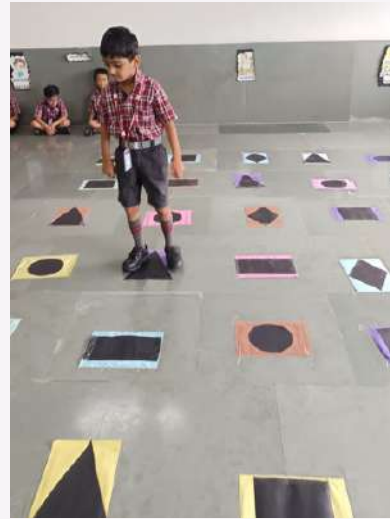
# Mathematics Week
