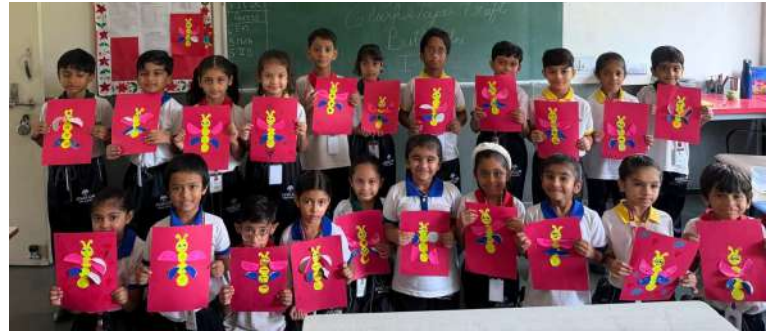
Shapes Day helped our young learners develop their observation skills, creativity, recognition of shapes, and fine motor skills, while making learning enjoyable.

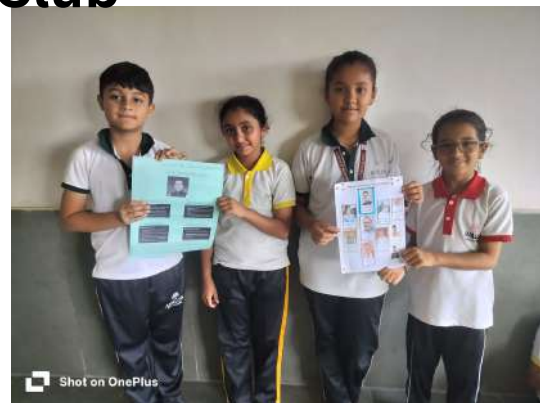

10-15 August

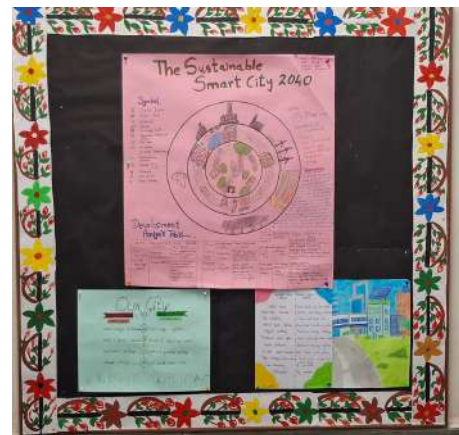
